Dec. 20 tell Ford: No Appeal of Bill 124

Five unions will hold a Day of Action on December 20, calling on the Ford government not to appeal Bill 124.

We are asking all members to protest by wearing a sticker and sending an electronic postcard to the Premier.

Bill 124, limits wage increases to 1% a year for 3 years. The law was struck down by an Ontario court in Nov. but the Ford government has announced it will appeal.

An appeal would take years and deny you the right to bargain a real wage increase now. (More page 2)
